#### Watch for Chinook Salmon in Lower Alameda Creek

The stream flow in lower Alameda Creek flood control channel peaked at nearly 2,000 cfs Wednesday night, is now back up to nearly 1,000 cfs, and there is more rain coming this weekend. It's a little early for steelhead trout to arrive, but these storms may bring chinook salmon into the lower creek.
