June 12 - SFPUC Meeting on Alameda Watershed Habitat Conservation Plan - Dublin

The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission will hold an open house meeting on their Alameda Watershed Habitat Conservation Plan on Tuesday, June 12, from 6:30 to 8 PM at the Dublin Civic Center, at 100 Civic Center Plaza in Dublin. The meeting will update the public on implementation, funding, assurances, alternatives and covered fish species for the Habitat Conservation Plan, a conservation program to protect sensitive species in the Alameda Creek watershed, while providing the SFPUC with permits and regulatory assurances for endangered species compliance. Coming this fall - Historical Ecology of the Alameda Creek Watershed

Robin Grossinger with the San Francisco Estuary Institute's Historical Ecology Program will give a presentation to Alameda Creek Alliance members on the fascinating findings of SFEI's soon-tobe-published historical ecology study for the Alameda Creek watershed. The study assesses historical watershed conditions prior to significant Euro-American modification, as a basis for understanding changes in the watershed and potential options for future environmental management. The geographic focus is the floodplains, valleys, and alluvial plains adjacent to Alameda Creek and its tributaries, including the Livermore and Amador valleys, Sunol Valley and Niles Canyon, and the Niles cone and adjoining baylands.
