Niles Canyon Stroll & Roll – September 30



This Saturday you can walk or bicycle through Niles Canyon along Niles Canyon Road, which will be carfree for the day!

The second Niles Canyon Stroll & Roll will be will be on Saturday, September 30, 2017. The Stroll & Roll is an opportunity to walk and bike through Niles Canyon without any vehicular traffic, and also to view sites of the proposed Alameda Creek Trail through the canyon. From 7 am to 8 am on September 30, the road through the Canyon will be closed to all vehicles and open only to cyclists. From 8 am to 2 pm the road will be open to all pedestrians and bicyclists to "stroll and roll" through. There will be 2 rest stops within the canyon that will have portable restrooms, water, and chairs. On the Fremont side, Niles Canyon Road will be closed from Mission Blvd. and Niles Canyon Road; from the Sunol side the road will be closed from Main Street and Niles Canyon Road.
